# Solit Help

Solit is a freely distributable shareware, solitaire card game under Windows 3.1.

The goal of Solit is to stack all the cards in ascending order on the four Ace Stacks.

# Game Layout

The playing area is divided into three different types of stacks of cards: Ace, Temporary and Main Stacks.

Ace Stacks are the final resting place of all the cards and are automatically controlled by the computer. They are located in the upper left and right corners of the playing area outlined by black borders.

Temporary Stacks are temporary card holders that can contain only one card each. They are located in the center of the playing area and shaded dark green.

Main Stacks are the main working area for manipulating cards and can grow as large as necessary. They are located below the Ace and Temporary Stacks across the width of the playing area.

#### Rules

Initially, all 52 cards are shuffled and dealt out into 10 Main Stacks containing five cards each. The remaining two cards are put in the middle two Temporary Stacks.

The cards can be moved subject to the following rules:

- 1) Only one card can be moved at a time.
- A card can only be placed on another if they are of the same suit and directly follow each other (*e.g.*, a 7 of Hearts can be placed on an 8 of Hearts but not on an 8 of Diamonds or Queen of Clubs.
- 3) Kings may be placed on empty Main Stacks.
- 4) Any card at the bottom of a Main Stack can be placed on an empty Temporary Stack

The Ace Stacks are managed by the computer which will automatically move any cards to them as they are uncovered. For example, if an Ace is uncovered, it will be moved to its appropriate Ace Stack. If later the 2 of the same suit is uncovered, it will also be moved.

Finally, multiple cards in a suit-run can be moved if empty Temporary Stacks are available to hold the extra cards beyond the first. This eliminates the hassle of moving all but the top card in the run to the empty Temporary Stacks and then moving them back to the Main Stacks.

## Game Controls

Cards are moved by left-mouse-button clicking on them, holding down the button and dragging them to their new stack.

The menu/toolbar consists of the following functions:

#### Game

New Quits the current game and deals out a new game.

Restart Restarts the current game.

Solve Not implemented. Exit Exits Solit.

### Options

Undo Move Un-does the last move.

Redo Move Re-does the last undo move.

Slide Cards Toggles sliding cards for computer card movement.
