Creating a Windows Help File

To create a help file for Windows, you will need a RTF input file and the Windows help compiler.

- **The RTF File**

The RTF file can be generated by a word processor capable of saving a file in that format, or by a utility like [RTFGEN](#).

- **The Help Compiler**

The help compiler is usually provided with the Windows language compilers from various software vendors.

Viewing a Windows Help File

As you already know if you're viewing this, you need the file WINHELP.EXE to view Windows Help Files. This file is included with Windows.

You can also use Microsoft's Multimedia VIEWER.EXE file to view Windows help files.
