Overview

Hex FileView is a Windows program which allows you to view any file in a hexadecimal and ANSI/ASCII character format. Files up to one gigabyte in length can be viewed. Operations possible with the currently loaded file include comparing, searching, printing and changing file contents. File attributes, file dates and file times can also be changed on multiple files at once.

Special files:

Sound files (WAV & MID) can be played if you have the appropriate sound drivers. Picture files (BMP, ICO & WMF) can be viewed as pictures. The files contained in archive files (ZIP & ARC) can be listed.

Fonts:

All loaded fonts can be viewed with the included program FontView which is accessible from within Hex FileView.

General usage:

Hex FileView is helpful in identifying files when doing system housekeeping and anytime a files internal structure needs to be examined. Most files internally have clues to their source, examples are copyright notices and header information for database files showing field names and sizes. With Hex FileView you can view any file to help determine what program it belongs to and its purpose.

File Menu

Load File: With this selection you load the file you wish to view.

Search for String: Use this selection if you want to search for a certain string of characters or hexadecimal values within the currently viewed file.

Write to File: This selection is used to write a string of characters or hexadecimal values to the currently viewed file. **WARNING:** Make back up copies of files before using this selection. Do not make changes to any file (especially .EXE or .COM files) unless you are absolutely sure of what the result will be.

File Compare: To determine if a file is identical to the currently viewed file use this option. If the files are not equal the program will allow you to display both files where the miscompare was found.

Print File: Use this selection to print the currently viewed file or a selected range of it.

Exit: This selection quits the program.

Disk Menu

Show Disk Info: This selection shows information about the disk that you select. The information includes; Volume Label, Total bytes & Free bytes.

Options Menu

Copy File: Copies a specified file.

Delete File: Deletes a specified file.

Change File Attributes: Used to change file attributes, file dates and file times.

View Picture: Used to view a currently loaded picture file (BMP, ICO or WMF) as a picture.

Play Sound: Used to play a currently loaded sound file (WAV or MID).

Show ARC/ZIP Contents: Lists the files contained in a currently loaded archive file (ARC or ZIP).

Font Viewer: Runs the FontView program which allows you to view any of your loaded fonts. For more information about FontView please view its help file.

Environment Options: This selection allows you to change display fonts and colors.

Show System Info: Displays system information such as version of DOS and Windows running on your system, processor type and mode.

Help Menu

Contents: Displays the contents of this help file.

Search for Help on: Allows you to search for help on a topic.

Help on Help: Displays the Windows Help on Help file.

Code Reference: Runs the code reference program which displays information about the ANSI and ASCII character sets and common file extensions. For more information about the Code Reference program please view its help file.

Registration Info: Displays information about registering Hex FileView.

About: Displays copyright and version information.

Registration

This program is a Shareware product. You may copy this program and distribute it to your friends for their evaluation. If you make use of this software you are expected to pay a registration fee. Please help support the Shareware concept by registering your Shareware programs. This will enable shareware authors to continue to write new programs.

Each registered user of this program may install this program on as many computers as they like as long as its not used at more than one location at the same time. (See the order form for multiple user site licenses). When you register this program you will receive a letter confirming your registration that will include a code to remove the message "Unregistered Shareware" from the title bar. E-mail and regular mail support will be free to registered users for one year. Free upgrades will be made available to registered users when the upgrades fix bugs that effect functionality, for a full year after registration. If a registered user has a problem with this program that effects functionality that we cannot correct, then a full refund of the registration fee will be offered. To register please print and fill out the ORDER.DOC file, which can be printed from the Registration Info selection of the Help menu.

Definition of Shareware

The following definition of Shareware is an excerpt from a file on Shareware provided by the Association of Shareware Professionals, prepared by Paul Mayer, author of GRAB Plus.

Shareware distribution gives users a chance to try software before buying it. If you try a Shareware program and continue using it, you are expected to register. Individual programs differ on details -- some request registration while others require it, some specify a maximum trial period. With registration, you get anything from the simple right to continue to using the software to an updated program with printed manual.

Copyright laws apply to both Shareware and commercial software, and the copyright holder retains all rights, with a few specific exceptions as stated in the license agreement. Shareware authors are accomplished programmers, just like commercial authors, and the programs are of comparable quality. (In both cases, there are good programs and bad ones!) For example, some authors require written permission before a commercial disk vendor may copy their Shareware.

Change File Attributes

This selection of the Options Menu is used to change a file(s) date & time and/or a file(s) attributes (The four file attributes are System, Hidden, Read Only and Archive).

To change file attributes:

1 - Select the file or files that you want to change attributes for from the File List by double clicking on the file name(s). The file(s) will then appear in the Selected Files list. (Note: the file date, time and attributes are displayed for the highlighted file name in the Selected Files list.)

2 - Change the attribute check boxes to the desired values.

3 - Click the Set Attributes button. After clicking the button all the Selected Files will have their attributes set as you indicated in step 2.

To change file date & time:

1 - Select the file or files that you want to change file date & time for from the File List by double clicking on the file name(s). The file(s) will then appear in the Selected Files list. (Note: the file date, time and attributes are displayed for the highlighted file name in the Selected Files list.)

2 - Change the file date and time to the desired values in the text boxes in the following format: date = mm/dd/yy time = hh:mm AM or hh:mm PM

3 - Click the Set "Date - Time" button. After clicking the button all the Selected Files will have their dates & times set as you indicated in step 2.

Play Sound

This selection of the Options Menu is used to play a sound file. Sound files have one of the following file name extensions: .WAV or .MID.

After selecting Play Sound the file will begin playing and the Play Sound window will appear. Controls on this form allow you to stop, pause, rewind and play.

Note: to use this feature you must have the proper sound drivers and hardware that support playing sound files.

Environment Options

This selection of the Options menu is used to set the programs file viewer display colors and font.

Titles, text and background colors can be set by clicking on the appropriate button and selecting the your choice of color.

Fonts may be set to either an ANSI character font or the ASCII font. Only one ASCII font is available which will be displayed immediately after clicking the ASCII Font button. The number of ANSI fonts available for use in this program is determined by the number of ANSI fixed pitch fonts you have loaded on your system.

The environment settings you choose can be automatically used every time you run this program by checking the "Save Environment Settings on Exit" box.

When you make a change to the colors or font selection, the changes are shown in the Preview window. After you have finished making your selections then click the Ok button to continue, or press Cancel to return the font and colors to their original settings.
