Welcome to **Whoop It Up!** With **Whoop It Up!** you can:

**Define sound or video events for any application!**

**Attach sounds or videos to system events!**

**Attach sounds to MessageBox icons!**

**Use the PC Speaker, SoundBlaster, Pro Audio Spectrum, Adlib, or any MIDI or WAVE device that Windows 3.1 supports!**

You must have Windows 3.1 configured for a wave or midi sound device to use **Whoop It Up!** You should use the Control Panel Sounds application to add a sound driver to your system before using **Whoop It Up!** To play videos you must install Microsoft Video for Windows runtime. The Video for Windows runtime software is available on Compuserve in the WINEXT forum, Library 2.

When you register your copy of **Whoop It Up!** you will receive:

**Latest version of Whoop It Up! on diskette.**

**Over one megabyte of high quality sound files**

**Complete documentation and Windows Help file**

## Configuring Whoop It Up!

### Sounds

If your system is configured for any Windows 3.1 sound device, **Whoop It Up!** is ready to go.

If you don't have a sound card, you can get the Microsoft PC Speaker Driver from Compuserve. GO MSL at any ! prompt and download SPEAK.EXE, a self-extracting ZIP file with the speaker driver and installation instructions. You can also download the driver without charge from the Microsoft Download

Service, (206) 936-MSDL.

Since **Whoop It Up!** improves upon the sound abilities of Windows 3.1, you should set all the Windows sound events except the Default Beep to "<none>" in the Control Panel Sounds application. If you wish, you may keep the Windows Start and Windows Exit events, but if the other events are configured for sounds you may here two sounds for some events; one that Windows plays and one that **Whoop It Up!** plays.

#### **Video**

If you wish to use Whoop It Up! to play videos, you must install the Video For Windows runtime. Normally this will be done during setup. To install the runtime at a later date, insert the Video For Windows setup diskette in your floppy drive and run SETUP.EXE.

Start **Whoop It Up!** by double clicking the **Whoop It Up!** icon in Program Manager. By default, **Whoop It Up!** is configured to start as a minimized icon on your desktop. Double click the icon to bring up the main **Whoop It Up!** window.
