## **Delphi RAD Pack**

Borland have announced a new add-on package for Delphi developers: the RAD Pack. Available from 1st June, it includes:

- > Complete VCL source code.
- > Resource Workshop for extracting and modifying Windows resources such as icons, cursors, bitmaps etc.
- > Resource Expert to convert Windows resource scripts into Delphi forms.
- > Printed Language Reference Guide for Delphi.
- > Turbo Debugger for Windows (with compatibility fixes for Delphi).
- > Visual Solutions Pack collection of VBXs, as reviewed in Issue 1 of The Delphi Magazine.

The RRP in the United Kingdom is £149 plus VAT.

#### **Online Delphi Documentation**

After having their corporate ears well and truly chewed by Delphi users, Borland quickly set to work producing a VCL Reference Guide and Language Reference Guide for Delphi. Printed versions are in the works and should be available for purchase from Borland by the time you read this.

However, Borland have also already made available electronic versions of these documents, in Adobe Acrobat format in the DELPHI forum on CompuServe in the *From Borland* library section. Beware, though, the files are very large! (they took nearly an hour to download at 14,400bps). Some user groups (like the Delphi Developers' Group in the UK) are making the files available to members for the cost of the diskettes and postage.

#### More Delphi Shareware

EMS Professional Shareware in the USA produce a range of CD-ROMS of shareware and freeware specifically for developers. Their new Pascal CD contains a range of Delphi material. See EMS's advert on page 6 for contact details.

#### **Accounting For Delphi**

ColumbuSoft, of Columbus, Ohio in the United States, now have a Delphi version of their accounting software modules, including: general ledger, accounts payable, accounts receivable, order entry (including invoicing, orders and quotations), purchasing, inventory, fixed assets and payroll. Job costing is due to be added soon.

The modules are solid, well tested, batch-oriented and are easy to call from most applications. European developers will be interested to know that there is some VAT support, but ColumbuSoft are aiming to enhance this area.

The idea is you licence the software for inclusion in your own programs (\$500 for the first module plus \$250 for each additional one, payable as a one-time fee), which means you don't have to reinvent the wheel! The database files are .DBFs, reflecting the software's Clipper origins.

## **Database Auditing**

SoftWerk UK are distributing WizRule for Windows, a database auditing tool which is claimed to discover rules and errors in a database.

# Free Software From TurboPower

Well, not quite, but you can obtain trial-run versions of their Orpheus and Async Professional products which are fully functional but only work when Delphi is running.

The final version of Orpheus is expected to ship in June (see TurboPower's ad on page 14, which also contains full contact details). Async Professional for Delphi is due to ship in July, there will be a free upgrade available for users of the existing APro for Windows.

The trial-run versions of both products can be downloaded from the CompuServe PCVENB (Library 6) and DELPHI (Library 22) forums, or by internet ftp from rmii.com:/pub2/turbopower/tpsfiles or from the TurboPower BBS on +1 (719) 260 9726. The filenames

are ORPHTR.EXE for Orpheus and APDTR.EXE for APro.

If you think the Borland Database Engine is too large and cumbersome, you may also be interested to know that a Delphicompatible version of B-Tree Filer is in the works at TurboPower. They are also hoping to be able to integrate the new version with Delphi's data-aware controls.
