GeoPoint Mapping Component

Visual Components' new GeoPoint is now available in the UK from Grey Matter Ltd. GeoPoint is a 32-bit component that displays data of all kinds by thematically shading the polygons of MapInfo and Auto-CAD drawings. GeoPoint is used in visual development environments that support 32-bit ActiveX controls (OCXs), and it allows application developers to add the power of standalone geographic information systems in their custom applications with ease and flexibility.

GeoPoint comprises two 32-bit ActiveX controls: a map shader and a legend. When linked to a data source, the map shader control employs an intelligent binning algorithm to sort and divide the data into categories. Shading of polygons in a specified MapInfo or AutoCAD file is performed by the map shader control based on the results of the binning algorithm. The legend control identifies the categories or "bins" created by the algorithm and helps the user interpret the map shading.

For example, an application that uses GeoPoint could graphically present the sales of a company in the UK by painting each county a shade of a particular colour that correlates to a level of sales. A developer might also use GeoPoint with an AutoCAD drawing of a sta-

dium or arena to show seating availability or ticket prices.

GeoPoint is available now from Grey Matter at £180 plus VAT. Applications built with GeoPoint can be distributed royalty-free, including the supplied maps.

Zip And Setup Toolkits

Hexanet of Paris, France, have announced the availability of Zip Studio Developer Edition, a development kit for creating files in ZIP format, and Visual Setup Studio which allows the creation of installation programs without any programming. Both come with complete source code.

Zip Studio comes as Delphi 1 and 2 components, 16- and 32-bit DLLs, a 32-bit OCX and 16-bit VBX. Sample projects are included.

Visual Setup Studio is suitable for creating install programs for both Windows 3.1 and Windows 95.

IntraBuilder Pricing

Borland have firmed up the pricing and configurations for its new Intranet creation product (see News, August 1996).

There will be three different configurations of the shipping version. The base product will be designed for workgroup and low-volume requirements. It will include

Netscape Navigator Gold and Borland's Personal Web Server, along with local data access to MS Access, MS FoxPro, dBase and Paradox data. The estimated price is £69 plus VAT.

Next up is the Professional version, which adds the Netscape Fast track Web server plus remote data access to SQL Server and IntraBuilder database servers. Support for a range of Web server APIs will also be included (NSAPI, ISAPI, CGI etc). New customers can buy it for £349 plus VAT, existing Delphi and Borland C++ customers can buy a crossgrade £299 plus VAT.

The Client/Server version adds native drivers for Oracle, Sybase, Informix and DB2 database servers plus ODBC. It allows developers to build multi-tier applications with Remote IntraBuilder Agents which distribute incoming requests amongst several machines. This version will cost £1279 plus VAT.

The IntraBuilder pre-release version has apparently notched up over 30,000 downloads from Borland's web site at http://www.borland.com/intrabuilder/.

AFD Postcode Updates

Major upgrades to AFD's line of UK postcode management software are now complete. The data engine has been improved, giving reduced data footprint (5Mb less) but with new data added, including: large or small user, unknown postcodes, multiple streets, county abbreviations and county data not supplied by the Royal Mail. Searching has been improved too.

Developer support is provided by 16- and 32-bit DLLs, with sample source in Delphi (and other mainstream languages). The cost is £181 plus VAT.

Sax's latest internet application development control is now available from Contemporary Software in the UK. It's a distributable Web browser in a 32-bit ActiveX control which can be used with Delphi 2, (as well as Visual C++ and VB4 if you must).

HTML 3.0 is supported (read from local files, a LAN, CD-ROM, database records or the web itself), there is full printer support, table support, a security filter to check pages for undesirable material, automated sessions, keyword searching, server communication and more.

The UK price is £110 plus VAT for the 32-bit version (suitable for Delphi 2) or £175 plus VAT for both the 16- and 32-bit versions.
