OnGuard

New from TurboPower Software, this product allows you to create 'try before you buy' versions of your Delphi software.

Aimed especially at the internet, the idea is that users can download your software, try it out in protected form and then contact you to purchase a key code to 'unlock' the application. The protection can include time limitations, locking certain features (eg file saving), limiting the number of executions and so on.

It also allows you to add network metering to your applications to

make sure that your 5-user licence program really is only used by 5 users!

Support for both 16-bit and 32-bit Delphi is included, plus full source code, for the princely sum of \$199 (ask your friendly dealer for local pricing).

ProtoView INTERACT

ProtoView's new InterAct lets you take static information and present it to the user in an interactive diagram. The user can also modify the diagram in your app.

Suggested uses include Tree Charts, real time status diagrams, manufacturing floor plans, process flows, network diagrams and hierarchy charts. ProtoView includes online help, a Diagramming Assistant and sample code in Delphi, C/C++ and VB.

This new release provides WYSI-WYG reports, labels, forms and barcodes for your programs with just a few lines of code. It's suitable for Delphi as well as most other development environments.

A Designer module is included for end users and a programmer module for you. You decide whether to allow end users to design their own reports, lists and labels, adapt existing ones or just print those you have created. The object types provided include text, tables, rectangles, lines, graphics, barcodes, callback and form templates.

The interface has also been given a thorough overhaul, so if you looked at an earlier version it's maybe time to re-evaluate.

TComponentCollector 2.0

If you use more than a few non visual components in your applications, it can sometimes be difficult to see your forms underneath all the component icons! I must confess I thought this was one of the few weaknesses of Delphi when it was originally release.

LingScape of Sweden released a Delphi 1 version of a component which collected all your non visual components together some time ago. Now they've brought out a new version, which supports both Delphi 1 and 2.

This new version not only lets you see your forms at design time, it will also help you to find your components quickly. It works in a way very similar to the Windows 95 auto hide taskbar. The developers claim it is now more intuitive.
