Basically you create an application in Delphi or C++Builder, using any of a wide range of the standard or third party user interface controls supported by Portcullis, and Shoreline's magic transforms this into a web application, complete with HTML forms equivalent to your Delphi forms.

Portcullis enhances security by allowing your application and its data to reside behind the firewall, isolated from the web server. Shoreline claim that with its automatic dynamic load balancing and sprocket technology, large and intensively used applications perform "with ease." Support is provided for all major web servers.

### **LockBox Encryption**

TurboPower Software are shipping a new data encryption and decryption library for Delphi. LockBox includes support for the 56-bit Data Encryption Standard (DES) but exceeds it to handle encryption keys of up to 128 bits.

# White Ants ModelMaker

Dutch software house White Ants have released White Ants Model-Maker 3.20 for Delphi, a tool that is claimed to boost productivity and development speed, even for less experienced developers. ModelMaker is a CASE tool and component builder covering the complete component life cycle. You can visually design in UMLstyle diagrams, create class members, edit your code and create help files. Seamless integration with Delphi allows you to maintain your design in ModelMaker and then debug and test the code in Delphi.

ModelMaker is not a one way wizard, but an active modelling engine. Actions like renaming a class or changing a method will automatically propagate to the instantly generated source code and throughout the model. White Ants say this encourages the user to refine and experiment with their design and code until it's just right and simplifies code maintenance.

Support is included for design patterns, which provide ready to use solutions for general design problems. A ModelMaker pattern is an active agent which not only inserts fragments of code, but also stays "alive" to update this code reflecting the changes made to the design.
