Delphi 4 Released

Delphi 4 was announced in mid June and by the time you read this copies should, we understand, be shipping.

For a summary of what you can find in the new version, see Brian Long's article in this issue (this is a preview of his full, detailed, review which will appear in the next issue of Developers Review).

HREF Announce WebHub 1.50

HREF Tools have released a new version of their Delphi component framework for developing web applications.

There are way too many new features to mention, but highlights include compatibility with COM, DCOM and Microsoft Transaction server objects, enhanced security, a new SendFileIIS method to make downloadable files available with dynamic names and/or content for secure software delivery, transparent support for cookie based session numbers, dataset cloning for enabling single user coding techniques in multi-user applications and recognition of Cold Fusion and Microsoft FrontPage tags. The WebHub Wizard can create complete projects from shared panels, forms and data modules.

The WebHub VCL Developer Bundle costs \$365 for a single developer. Hub licences cost from \$95 per additional server, depending on the number of application instances. The WebHub Shopping Cart Jump Start Package costs \$219 per developer. For more details or to order, visit www.href.com

VCL Form To HTML Converter

This is a new product from HREF Tools, makers of WebHub, which allows Delphi and C++Builder developers to convert forms to HTML.

Ten standard controls (and their custom descendants) are supported, including labels, memos, edits, checkboxes, radio buttons, listboxes and more. Supported containers for controls are TCustomForm, TGroupBox and TPanel, plus any other TWinControl container. The component outputs files as regular HTML and (optionally) as WebHub-HTML chunks. It will also adjust syntax for different browsers to make the output look just right.

The cost is \$99 when purchased directly from HREF Tools at their website (www.href.com), where a trial version is available.

ESRI ARC/INFO 7.2

ESRI has announced the latest $release\ of\ their\ GIS\ product.$

Amongst the new features and improvements is the introduction of a new extension, ArcSDE: a release of ESRI's Spatial Database Engine which integrates ESRI's SDE client/server technology within ARC/INFO. The data includes table associations, support for dynamic segmentation in the form of measures, multipart features, and a feature-linked annotation model. The product performs data extraction, transformation, cleaning and conversion across an extremely wide array of data structures and formats. Support has been added for new formats including Oracle8, DB2 and the mass insert interfaces for Microsoft SQL Server and Sybase Adaptive Server. Sorting support is included for ASCII, binary, COBOL, Btrieve, C-tree, and C-ISAM data sources.
