CodeBase Updates

Sequiter Software have updated their CodeBase database engine and the CodeBase Components for Delphi which give Delphi developers access to the engine.

Version 6.5 of the CodeBase engine includes Unicode support (for Delphi and C/C++ users) and works with Visual FoxPro fields and large files. It costs \$314 plus VAT from Grey Matter.

CodeBase Components II for Delphi is a complete BDE replacement which lets you use native Delphi controls with CodeBase. It is compatible with CodeBase 6.2 and higher and supports all versions of Delphi. It includes TDataSet descendnat components that allow for BDE replacement, as well as many data aware controls, including grid, list box, edit box and so on.




Borland Announce CLX Framework Details

Borland recently announced details of their CLX component library for cross-platform development. The library will sit alongside the VCL in Delphi 6 and will also be used in Delphi and C++Builder for Linux (codenamed Kylix).

CLX is based on the VCL, but is specifically designed to be platform-independent. It uses the OT libraries from TrollTech (www.trolltech.no) to provide the same functionality under both Windows and Linux. In a special deal with TrollTech, developers using Delphi 6 or Delphi for Linux will be able to distribute required QT libraries with their applications royalty free.

'CLX is an exciting next step for mainstream software application development,' said Michael Swindell, director of product management for Borland. 'CLX and the Kylix Project incorporate object oriented programming, rapid visual development, crossplatform and fully native code, with speed and reliability.'

DBISAM 2.0

From Elevate Software, DBISAM is a proprietary database engine specifically tailored to Delphi programmers. The most important feature of the engine is that all native Delphi field types are supported. It includes built-in repair and restructure facilities and automatic free space recycling for data records, index pages, and BLOb blocks. It is ideal if you want low-overhead database support and aren't concerned with thirdparty access.

Abakus VCL 2.01

ABaecker have recently released a new version of this suite of Delphi and C++Builder components for virtual instrumentation. Abakus VCL includes a compass, meters, gauges, digital indicators (for time and value), tank displays, an operating point display, an 8 channel trend recorder, a 2 channel trend display, a dial, sliders, an LED indicator, buttons, switches, a text indicator, an operating-hour counter and a threaded timer to supply all the components with a common clock. New from Developer Express these Delphi components (both data-aware and non data-aware versions are included) provide display and editing of hierarchical tree data structures. such as the contents of a book or a disk file system. Each node of the chart can have an unlimited number of children. displayed horizontally, directly below a given node. The contents and appearance of both the entire chart structure as well as each individual node can be amended as you wish.
