Getting Started

Each SoftwareVAULT collection contains thousands of programs and resources of every size and variety. To help you find your way through this sea of software, we have included the SoftwareVAULT Librarian program. This is a program that will

- 1 Let you sort through the thousands of programs and resources in the SoftwareVAULT collections.
- 2 Help you find programs of interest.
- 3 Help you transfer these programs or resources to your hard drive.

Please note that to use SoftwareVAULT files you MUST transfer them to your hard drive before you can use them.

The files on the CD-Rom are compressed and must be "UNZIPPED" to your hard drive so they can be accessed. (Don't worry, the Librarian does this automatically for you.)

(We "ZIP" our files up so that we can include more software on each SoftwareVAULT collection, giving you more value for your dollar.)

Tutorial... A lesson in fun

How To Use the Files on This CD-Rom.

You can use any of the thousands of programs and resources on a [SoftwareVAULT](#) Collection with just a few easy steps:

Step 1

Find and select an Area of interest. You can either "[browse](#)" through various file "[Groups](#)" using the "Contents" menu item or "[Find](#)" specific subjects using the "[Search](#)" menu item. You'll discover long lists of files, each followed by a one sentence description of what that file does. Once you find one that looks interesting, double-click on it with your mouse, or press "**ENTER**". An extended description will appear. Not all files have an extended description so you may see the same information as the single line description. You may also click on the VIEW button.

Step 2

Find and select a file that you would like to use. When you click on the VIEW button, you will see a picture or the contents of the [zip](#) file. If you have defined an "association" for your graphics files, we will run your program associated with the selected file. (If you are unfamiliar with associations, see your Windows manual under FILE MANAGER). If you are viewing the contents of a [zip](#) file in the [Files Processor Dialog](#), you may [copy](#) or [unzip](#) this file to your hard disk. Unless you're a veteran [SoftwareVAULT](#) user, browsing the file contents and copying the file to your hard disk might be confusing. In order to use the file or run the program, THE MENU OPTION YOU ALWAYS NEED TO SELECT IS "[UNZIP TO HARD DRIVE](#)". Selecting "[Unzip to hard drive](#)" will properly decompress the file and transfer it to your computer.

Step 3

Select the drive and directory in which to put your file. Once you've chosen to [unzip](#) the file to your hard disk, a directory selection menu will appear on your screen. To change the path, click through the "Directories" selection box until you find a path that matches where you want to put your de-compressed files. Make a note of where you put your files so you can find them once the [Librarian](#) is finished!

Step 4

Use your file. Exit the [Librarian](#) and go to the directory you created to hold your file. You will discover that your one [ZIP](#) file has probably decompressed into a collection of smaller files. To start the program, look for the file with a ".exe" on the end of its name. This is the main executable for the program. Running it should start the program!

Files Processor Dialog

There are three different options in the Files Processor Dialog. You can either view the contents of the zip file, copy the file to your hard drive, or unzip the file to your hard drive. Unless you're a veteran SoftwareVAULT user, unzipping the file contents and copying the file to your hard disk might be confusing. Selecting Unzip to hard drive will properly decompress the file and transfer it to your computer.

Copy a File

To copy a file, do the following:

- When in the File Browser window, put your cursor (the highlighted bar) on the file you are interested in and click on the **VIEW** button. This will cause the Files Processor Dialog to appear.
- From the Files Processor Dialog, click on "**COPY**". This is the first item on the bottom bar.
- Selecting this option will display a "File Save As" window. Here, you will need to choose the directory where the file(s) will be copied to.



If you are Copying more than one file to your hard drive, we recommend that you put each file in a different directory. If you don't, some files with common names may overwrite each other.

UnZip a File

To unzip a file, do the following:

- When in the File Browser window, put your cursor (the highlighted bar) on the file you are interested in and click on the "**UNZIP**" button. This will cause the Files Processor Dialog to appear.
- From the Files Processor Dialog, click on "Unzip". This is the second item on the bottom bar.
- Selecting this option will display a "File Save As" window. Here, you will need to choose the directory where the file(s) will be unzipped.



If you are unzipping more than one file to your hard drive, we recommend that you put each file in a different directory. If you don't, some files with common names may overwrite each other.

View a Picture

To view a graphics picture, do the following:

- When in the File Browser window, put your cursor (the highlighted bar) on the file you are interested in and click the **VIEW** button. If you have defined an "association" for your graphics files, we will run your program associated with the selected file. (If you are unfamiliar with associations, see your Windows manual under FILE MANAGER).



Loading a picture for viewing may take a few moments. See the "Tutorial" section of this help file.

GIF

A graphics picture. The initials stand for **G**raphics **I**nterchange **F**ormat. If you have defined an "association" for your graphics files, we will run your program associated with the selected file. (If you are unfamiliar with associations, see your Windows manual under FILE MANAGER).

Menus

From the menus listed below, you can do most anything in the SoftwareVAULT Librarian. The menus will assist you in navigating the Librarian and performing all functions.

File Menu

From the File Menu you can perform many utility functions including changing CD-Rom's, Setting up your printer, printing catalogs or setting up a BBS import of any SoftwareVAULT collection.

Change CD-Rom

Select "Change CD-Rom" to use other SoftwareVAULT Collections. When you select "Change CD-Rom", be sure to place the CD-Rom you would like to use in your CD-Rom drive.



If you are running the Librarian directly from your CD, this option will be disabled.

Export Listings

From this dialog box, select the type of output from the list box on the left (**Export List Types**). Then select the area(s) you wish to export from the list box on the right (**Areas To Export**). If you want to export all areas, check the box titled "**Tag All Areas**". If you want your output to be in a single file, check the box titled "**Write To One File**". When you have finished, press "**GO**" and you will be given a File Selection Dialog. This is where you select a directory to put your file(s) in. You must also supply a filename for the exported file(s). The export will start and your progress will be displayed.



If you are exporting separate files for each area, the filename will be what you typed in the file selection box and the extensions will be 01, 02, 03, etc.

Print Listings

From this dialog box, select the type of output from the list box on the left (**Printed Form Types**). Then select the area(s) you wish to export from the list box on the right (**Areas To Print**). If you want to print all areas, check the box titled "**Tag All Areas**". If you want your output to be in a single file, check the box titled "**Print To One List**". When you have finished, press "**GO**" and you will be given a Print Dialog. This is where you select a printer. After your selection, press "**OK**". Your printing will start and your progress will be displayed.



If you are printing separate files for each area, a formfeed will be issued and the next area will start on a new page

Printer Setup

Use this command to select a printer and a printer connection.

Dialog Box Options

Printer

Select the printer you want to use; only installed printers appear. You install printers and configure ports through the Windows Control Panel. For information on installing printers, see your system documentation.

Setup

Displays a dialog box so you can control default printer settings for the printer you select. For more

information, choose the Help button after you choose the Setup button.



The options in the setup dialog box will vary, depending on the printer you have installed. The title of the setup dialog box also changes to reflect the printer.

Exit

Select "Exit" to leave the SoftwareVAULT Librarian.

Contents Menu

The Contents Menu allows you to explore [SoftwareVAULT](#) in two different ways with either [Group Browser](#) or [Browse-Copy Files](#). It also contains [Hottest Hits](#) and [Statistics](#).

Browse-Copy Files

If you don't want to sort through [groups](#) of software categories, you can explore the entire [category](#) list. Clicking on a specific [category](#) will bring up a complete list of all the programs and resources contained in that [category](#). See the [Tutorial](#) section of this help file to see how to use these programs.

Hottest Hits

Each [SoftwareVAULT](#) collection contains an assortment of the very best [shareware](#) programs on the market today. "Hottest Hits" Info contains complete reviews of these outstanding programs.

Statistics

Statistics provides a statistical breakdown on the makeup of this [SoftwareVAULT](#) Collection. It displays [File Areas](#), Total number of files in each area and the total number of File Bytes used by each area.

Search Menu

The [SoftwareVAULT Librarian](#) allows you to search for files that interest you in several different ways:

Choose Area

Executes the Librarian's [Browser](#)-for a specific [area](#).

Find Filename

Allows you to find files based on their title. Type a title into the [Find File](#) box and click on the OK button. The [Librarian](#) will assemble a list of the files with titles similar to the one you specified. See the Tutorial section of this help file to see how to use these programs.

Find Text

Allows you to run a keyword search to find files on certain subjects. Type a keyword into the Find Text box. The [Librarian](#) will sort through the descriptions of all the files on the disc and will list files with subjects related to your keyword. See the [Tutorial](#) section of this help file to see how to use these programs.

Text Menu

The text files contain information on how the [SoftwareVAULT](#) collections are assembled and how you can register [shareware](#) programs requiring registration. You will also find information about [Digital Impact](#), the copyrights on the [Librarian](#), warranties and Technical Support. There is also information about the virus precautions we take and the utilities we use.

All CD's Menu

Selecting All CD's allows you call up a master files listing for all of the other SoftwareVAULT collections. The master listing is topically organized by Rom and then by Area. Files are alphabetical within each area. The SoftwareVAULT collections are listed below and will appear in a window on the bottom left of the Browser. The Area that the file is in will appear in a window on the bottom right of the Browser

If you would like to examine a listed file use the Change CD-Rom function found under the File menu to switch to the appropriate collection and then the Find Filename function in the Search menu to retrieve the file.



All CD's uses a global search for text. Click in the magnifying glass to invoke the Find Dialog. This search will even find text contained in other text.

Help Menu

Selecting help opens this help file. If you are having difficulty understanding how to use this help file, click on the "Help" menu item above. Or, if you're really in a hurry, click on the [Speedbar](#) button.



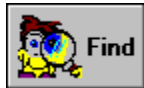
From this menu you may also select "**Help On Help**", "**Search for Help on ...**", learn "**How to use Help**" and see "**About**" the [Librarian](#).

Speedbar

The SoftwareVAULT Librarian is equipped with a speedbar. This is a group of pushbuttons that makes using the Librarian quick and easy.



This button will activate the search by area (or category) function. A list showing all areas available will pop-up and you can select an area to browse.



This button displays the Find Text window. This is where you enter any text that you want to find, and the Librarian will find all files with this text in their description.



Clicking your mouse on this button will close the Librarian and return you to the Windows Program Manager. This has the same effect as selecting "Exit" from the File Menu.



Clicking this button will get you detailed Help in a hurry.

Keyboard

Alt-F - Activates the File menu.

Alt-C - Activates the Contents menu.

Alt-S - Activates the Search menu.

Alt-T - Activates the Text menu.

Alt-A - Activates the All CD's menu.

Alt-H - Activates the Help menu.

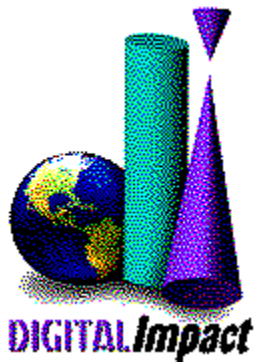

Unzip To Hard Drive

Selecting this option will display a "File Save As" window. This is where you choose the directory to unzip the file(s).



If you are unzipping more than one file to your hard drive, we recommend that you put each file in a different directory. If you don't, some files with common names may overwrite each other.

All CD's

This is a reference to a history file of all CD-Rom collections from the SoftwareVAULT.

Areas

An Area is a sub-directory on the CD-Rom that contains all files of a similar nature, i.e. "Games". We also use the word "Category" interchangeably with "Area".

BMP

BMP stands for Bit MaPped graphic. This is a common graphics type used by Windows programs. A .BMP graphic can also be used for Windows wallpaper. If you have defined an "association" for your graphics files, we will run your program associated with the selected file. (If you are unfamiliar with associations, see your Windows manual under FILE MANAGER).

Browser

This is the large list box that allows you to see a listing of the files in a given Area or Category. These files may have extensions like "GIF", "BMP" or "ZIP".

Category

An Category refers to a group of files on the CD-Rom that contain files of a similar nature, i.e. "Games". We also use the word interchangeably with "Area".

Dialog

A window that asks you a question requiring a response, or gives you an informative message.

Find File

When you use the Find File dialog from the Search Menu, you may enter any filename (or part of a filename) and the Librarian will search for it.

Groups

A Group may contain references to one or more Areas or Categories. If a Group button on the main window is "grayed out", it means that there are no files or Areas that apply to that collection.

Librarian

This is the File Manager designed for and used by the SoftwareVAULT collections.

Shareware

Shareware software is a unique marketing approach which allows you to purchase software directly from the author. This eliminates costly marketing, promotion, and packaging; allowing you to obtain quality software at a fraction of the commercial cost. You are encouraged to examine a program, copy it, and pass it on to friends. If you find the software program useful, you are asked to register with the software author. This usually means paying a registration fee directly to the shareware author. In return for this registration fee, you receive the right to continue to use the software and added benefits such as full documentation, technical support, and future updates of the program. This is the Try-Before-You-Buy concept.

SoftwareVAULT

The name of a series of CD-Roms produced by Digital Impact. These CD-Roms contain shareware files and programs, Public Domain files and programs, and Pictures or Clip Art.

Unzip

The process of removing (uncompressing) files from their envelopes. This is the opposite of Zipping (or compressing) the files.

Zip

A process of compressing many files into one file. This process saves space and insures that files stay together.
