European Developers Can Put It on Plastic, Too

European developers can now use Visa and MasterCard to purchase technical materials from CATS, West Chester. There will be a \$15.00 shipping and handling charge and all orders will be shipped next day air. Only current authorized developers can use this service; a developer number must appear on all orders.

Developers without a Visa or MasterCard may continue to order by check (U.S. dollars), but they must include the \$15.00 shipping and handling charge and a \$25.00 dollar fee for processing foreign checks.

The credit card program was expanded to European developers to let them avoid the \$25.00 foreign check processing fee.

In the U.S.A., commercial developers may use credit cards to purchase materials from CATS.
