# Receiving a check by FAX , E-MAIL or PHONE 



The route \# is the 9 digit number on the bottom most portion of the check starting and ending with symbols similar to $\mid$ : . In the line $\# \underline{4}$ it is the first set of numbers in the
example above, but note it can be the second set of numbers on the check.
Route\# |: |:

The account \# is the second set of numbers in line \# $\mathbf{4}$ of the sample above and ends with a symbol, but note it can be the first set of numbers on your check. The account number does not start with a symbol.

## Account\#

The last set of numbers in line \# $\underline{4}$ is your check \#.
Your Check \# is also displayed next to \#3.
Your Check \#
The bank Branch \# is the number next to \#링. It is 1 to 3 digits long and will be in bold type.

## Branch\#

Your Country Code is next to \#1. Your checks may look different so the numbers may look like i.e.: 1-218/9857/023456789. The country code is the first digit in this example (the number one in bold print). $\mathbf{1 - 2 1 8}$ in this example the country code is the bolded \# 9857
