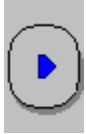
If it is a dashed underline the information will be presented as a popup window.

What are Zip files



What are Zip files and what can I do with them?



Zip files contain compressed copies of one or more files.



You can extract files from a Zip or you may add other files to a Zip.



Zip files are a good way of packaging multiple files for distribution.



You can split large Zip files across diskettes.

What is Zip Wizard Pro



There are two parts to Zip Wizard Pro !



The **Zip Wizard**(tm) portion assists you in adding and extracting files from your Zip files .



The **Zip Pro Navigator**(tm) provides expert users Drag & Drop Zip management tools.

New Technology



Makes using Zip Wizard an intuitive visual operation.

No more complex options.

True WYSIWYG* operation on Zip files.

*what you see is what you get.

Improved Tools



The Zip List: *(We invented it. Now we have made it better!)*

The Zip List is designed to give you instant access to all your Zip files without having to navigate to there home folder.

The Zip List is a special folder that shows you all your Zip files no matter where they are.

You can have the Zip List show any set of Zip files on your computer.

New Ease of Use



Home folders:

Home folders are an organizational tool. They make it easier to keep track of your zip files and the files that you extract from Zip files.



New Zip files will be placed in the "My_Zips" home folder.



UnZipped files will go into a new folder in the "UnZipped" folder.

Wizard Overview



Zip Wizard has 2 buttons to guide you.



You [add files](#) to a new or existing Zip file by clicking this **Zip Wizard** button.



You [extract files](#) from within a Zip file by clicking this **Unzip Wizard** button.

(Note: These buttons are found in Zip Wizard and in Zip Pro Navigator.)

Zip Wizard Overview



Adding files to a Zip file is a simple three step operation.



Step 1: You select the files to Zip.



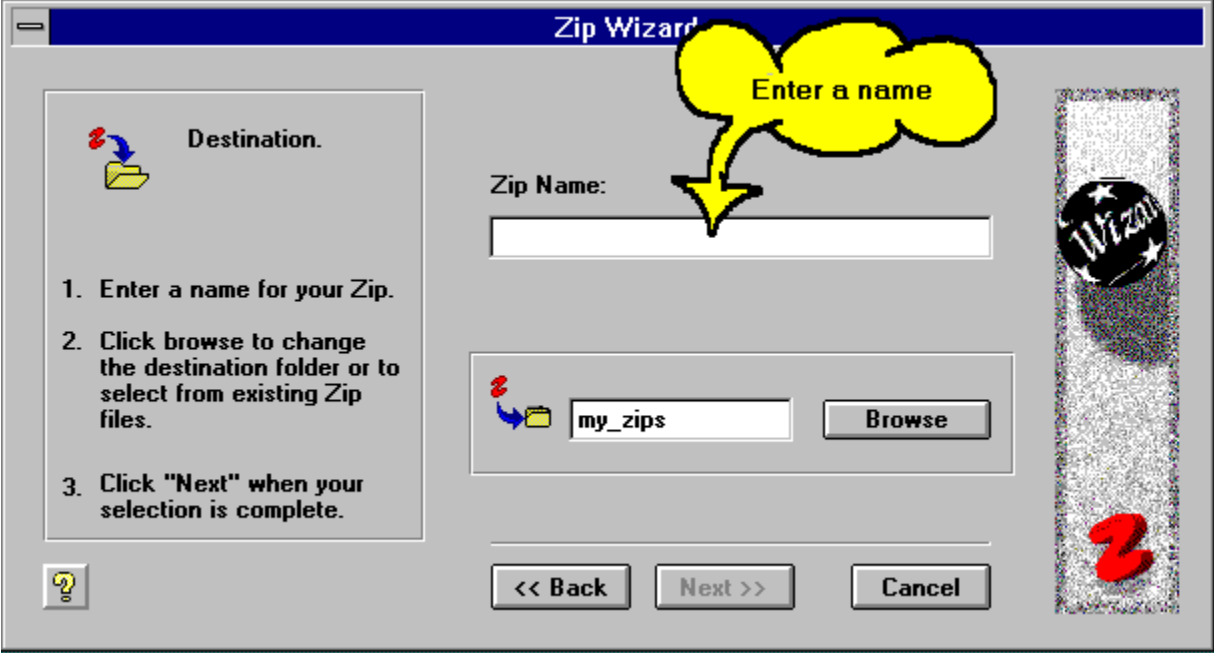
Step 2: Give a name to your Zip File.

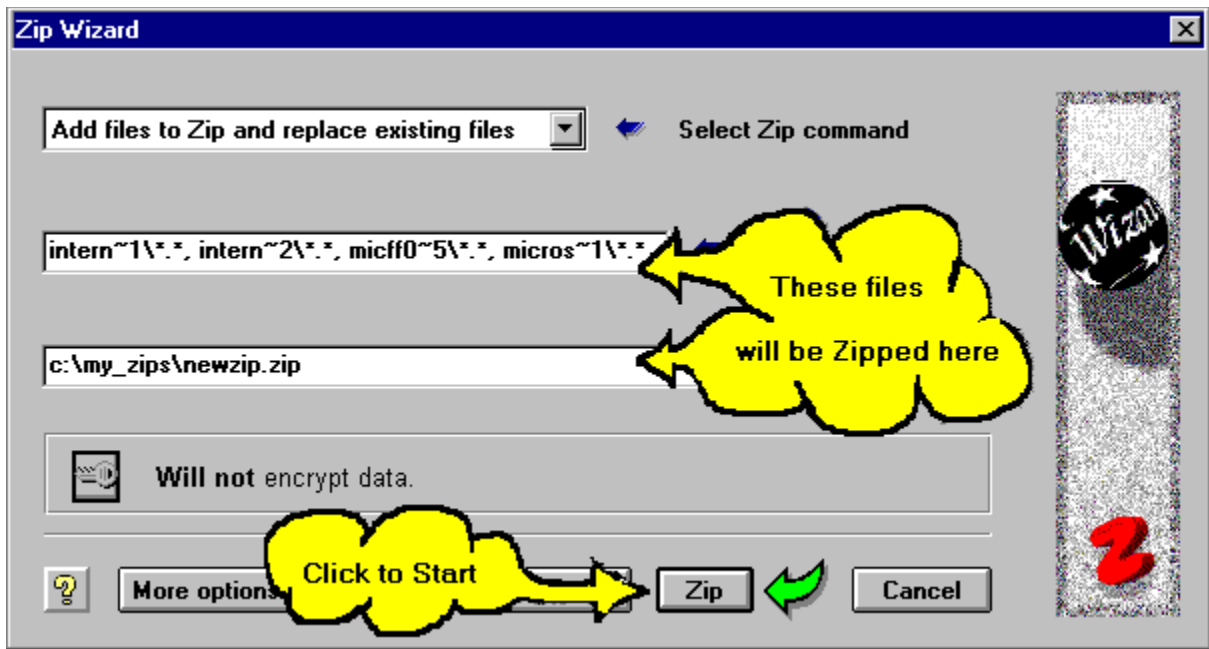


Step 3: Review and then Zip it.

(Note: Instructions for each step are on the left side of the Wizard panel.)







Unzip Wizard Overview



Extracting files from a Zip file is just four steps.

Step 1: Select the Zip file.

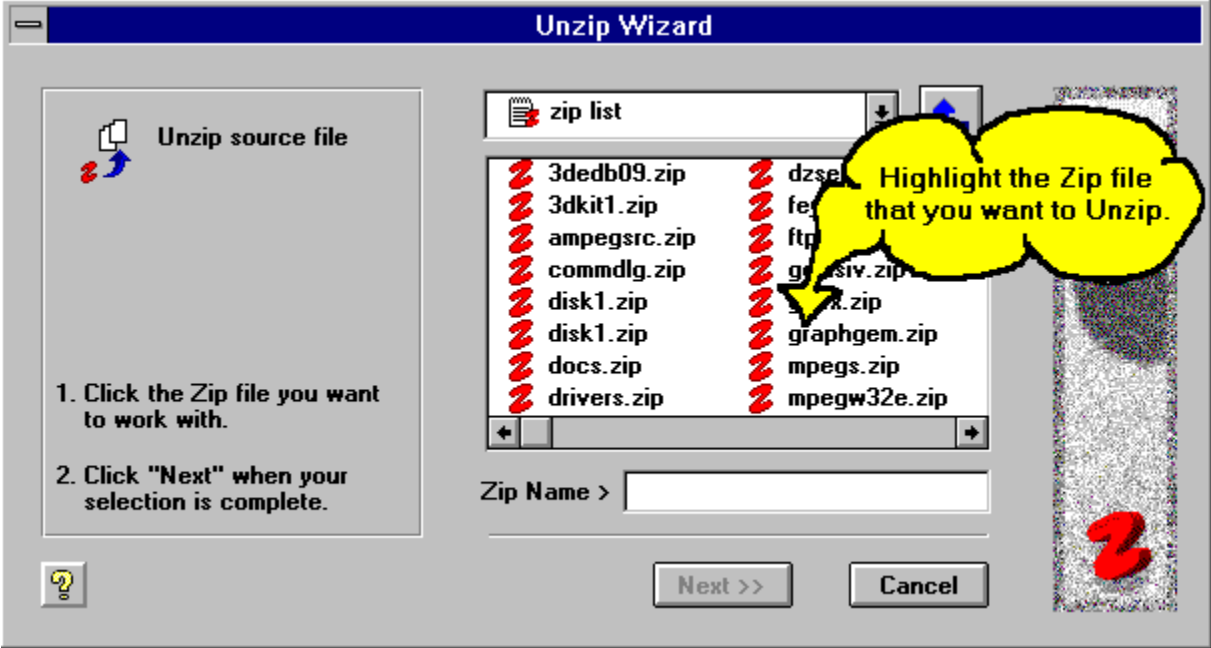
Step 2: Select the files within it to extract.

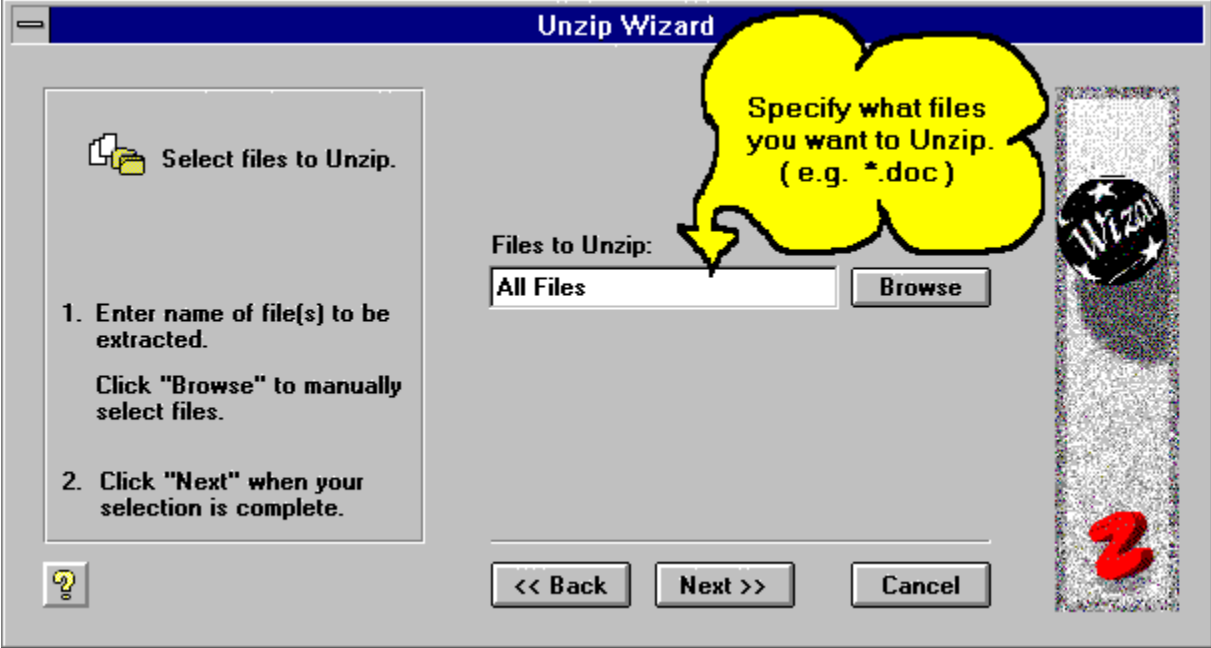
Step 3: Choose the destination folder.

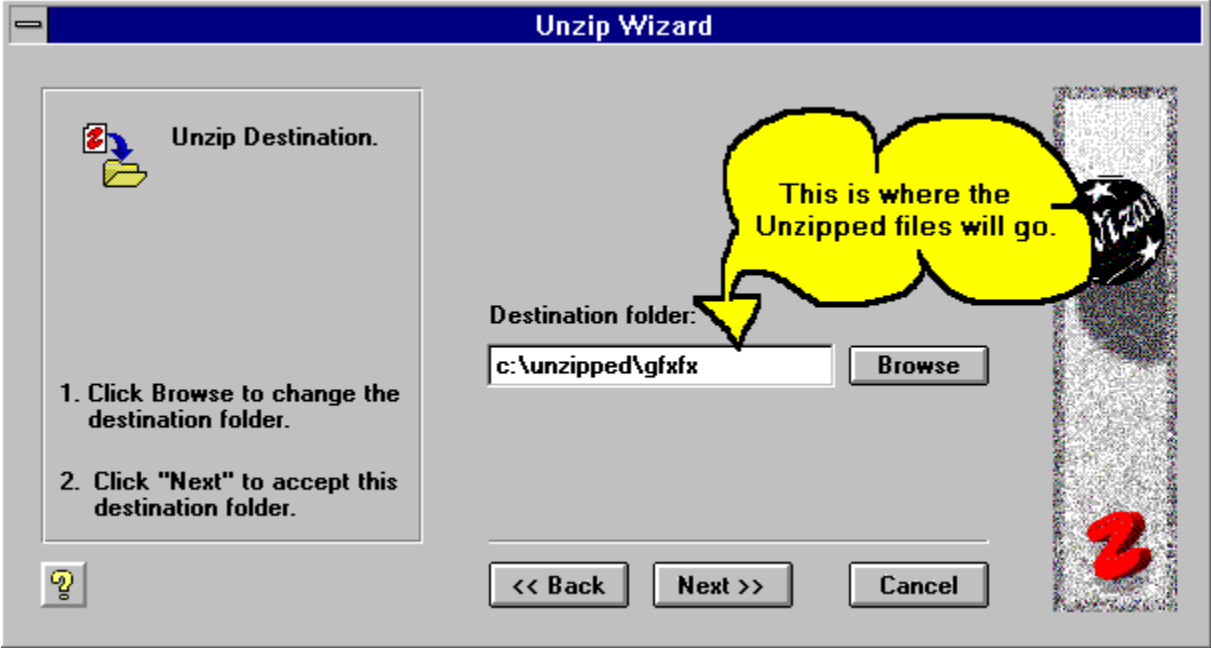


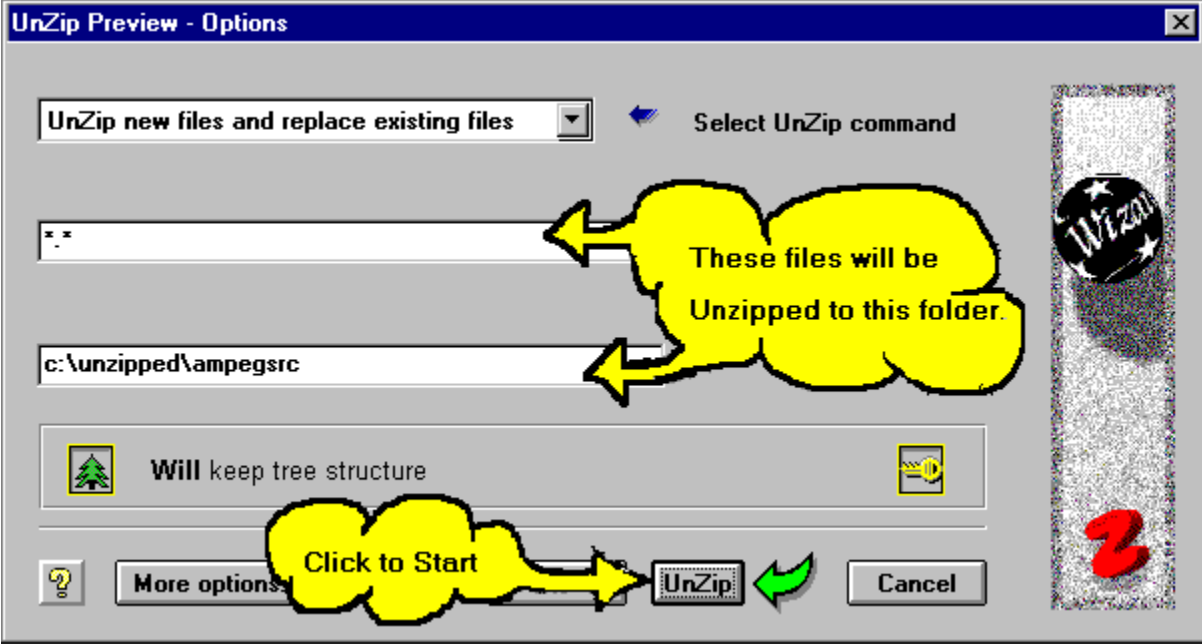
Step 4: Review and then Unzip them.

(Note: Instructions for each step are on the left side of the Wizard panel.)










Wizard Recap

Zip Pro Navigator

The Navigator is your control panel for file and Zip management.

Besides the Zip Wizard buttons, there are are four main buttons you use in Navigator:



Zip Views allow you to directly view and manipulate the contents of individual Zip files.



The Computer Views allow you to view the contents of your entire computer from one window.



There is also powerful Finder View which allows you to manipulate groups of files.



Our unique Zip List View provides you a live listing of all the Zip files on your computer.

The Computer Button

The Computer Window shows the contents of the "Folders" on your computer:

There are 2 different panels you can use:

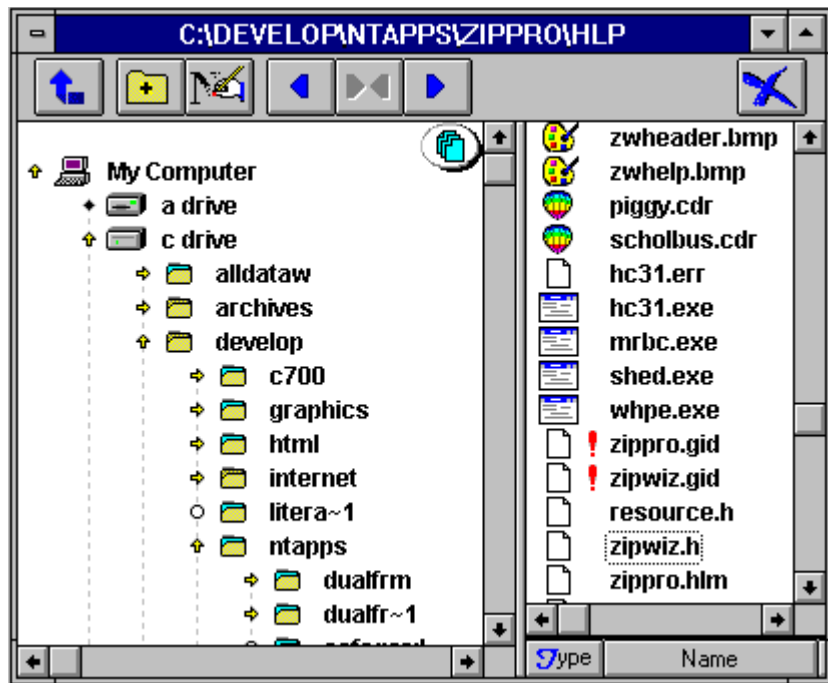
▶ The Content View on the right side shows the contents of the current Folder.

The Tree View on the left side shows a hierarchial view of your computer.



Use these buttons to switch between Content view, Split view and Tree view respectively.
(Content view is the default view).

The Computer Window



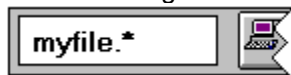

The Finder Button

The Finder Window shows groups of files on your computer:

You decide what files are to be viewed by:


Setting the search criteria (i.e. *.doc for all your "DOC" files).



Click folders in the Tree View to see their contents in the Content View:

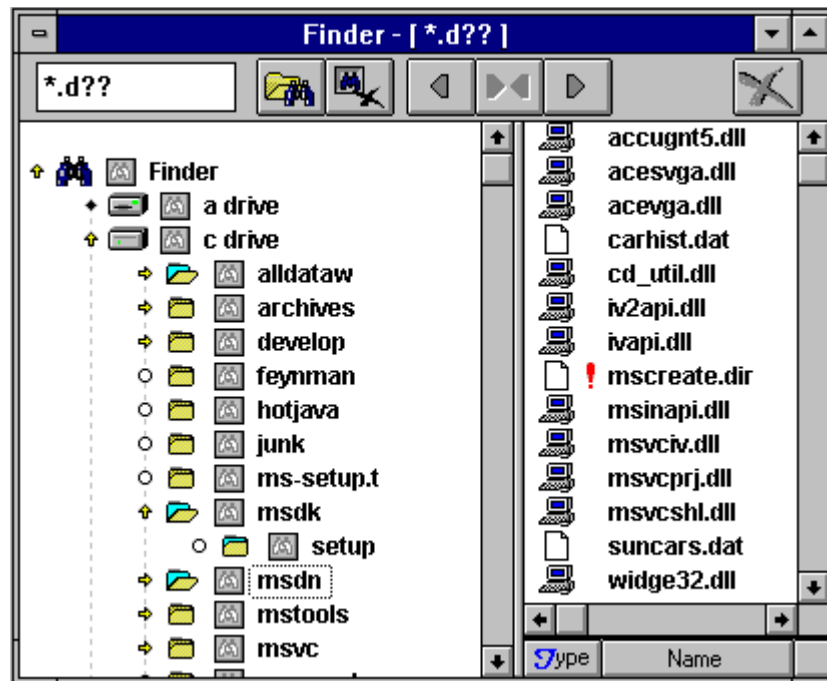
Click and Drag to open folders.

Ctrl/Shift + Click to open a set of folders. *

Click the scan button
 to search a folder and its subfolders.

(*) Note: If you click on the folder icon you do not have to hold the Ctrl key to do an extended selection.

The Finder Window

The Open Button





The Zip Window displays the contents of a Zip file:




Each Zip file contains a compressed copy of one or more files.

The Zip view shows the name and properties of each file contained within the Zip file.



Use the Zip view buttons  &  to add or extract files from the Zip.

The Docked Zip List Button


The Docked Zip List shows a list of all the Zip files on your computer.

The Dock Zip List is a special window that sticks to the right side of the Navigator window to provide quick access to your Zip files.

The Docked Zip List overlays any other windows in the Navigator but you can show or hide the Docked window as required using the Docked Zip List button.

Note: The Zip List is a **special folder** that contains **pointers to Zip files** on your computer or network. Although it appears as a folder, it does not exist on a drive and only has pointers to the actual files in their folders. (i.e. Your Zip files **have not** been duplicated or moved to another folder).

Click the area you want more information on:

The Main Menu

Use the File menu to perform Zip Pro actions (i.e. Zip/Unzip).

Use the Options menu to set window and Zip options.

Use the Window menu to change the window layout.

Use the Help menu to access information on Zip Pro.

The Tool Bar

Use the Zip button to create or add files to a Zip file.

Use the Unzip button to extract files from an existing Zip file.

Use the Open button to open Zip view windows.

Use the Find button to select a specific set of files.

Use the Trash button to delete a Zip or files within.

Use exit to leave Zip Pro and save your workspace.

View Windows

You may open Drive Views or Zip Views.

Use drive views to select files to Zip or target directories to Unzip.

Use Zip views to select files to Unzip or delete.

The Status Bar

The Status Bar provides feedback on menu options.

Navigating

Using the Mouse:

Double click folders to view their contents.

Using the Keyboard:

Select folders using the **cursor (arrow) keys** to scroll.

Press Enter to view the contents of a cursored folder.

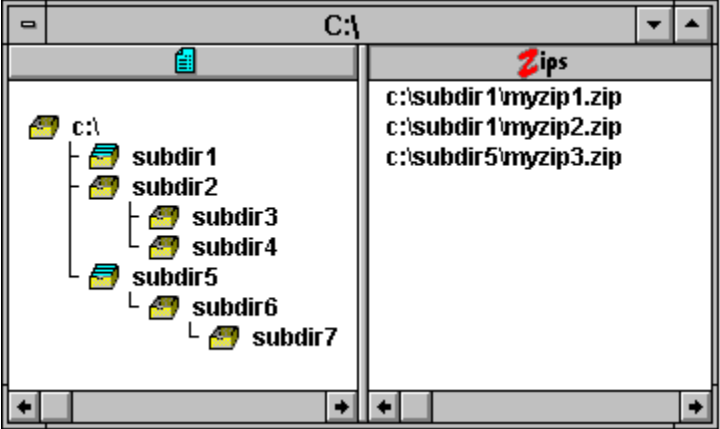
Press Shift + Enter to view the contents of the Parent of the current folder.

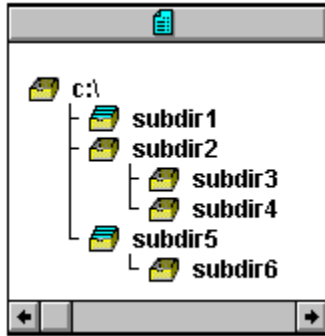
Use **Tab** to switch between the Content/Tree views.

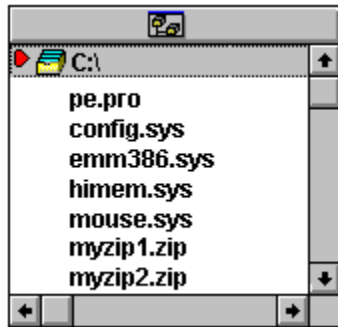
Use **Shift+Tab** to switch between the Drive Panel and the Zip List Panel.



















Use **Ctrl+Tab** to move between windows.

Use **Alt+Tab** to move between applications.

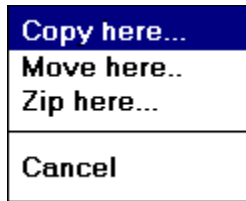








Context Menus



Zip Wizard Pro makes extensive use of Context Menus:

When you use the right mouse button to click an object (or to drag an object) a context menu will popup to show you the operations that can be performed.

These menus are totally dependent on the objects that are selected and the context of what you are doing.

Selecting Files



Selecting using the Mouse:

There are two main modes for selecting files.

New selection mode: Click and drag to create a selection, any files previously selected will be deselected. This is the default mode when the **cursor is to the right** of the object name.



Add / remove mode: Click and drag to add or remove files from the current selection. This is the default mode when the **cursor is to the left** of the object name.

Use can use the **left or right** button to select files.

- If you use the **right button** to select files a **context menu** will appear when you complete the selection.

To **switch between modes:**

- press and hold the Ctrl key.
- then Click a mouse button (and drag).

- To **add a block** of files from the last selection point: (in either mode)
- press and hold the Shift key.
 - then Click a mouse button and drag.

Using the keyboard:

Selecting Files



Selecting using the Keyboard:

Press and hold the SHIFT key while scrolling to select/deselect a group of files/directories.

Or press the SPACE BAR to select/deselect individual files/directories.

Drag & Drop Features



Drag & Drop Operation:

When the cursor is

you may drag and drop an object or selection.

You may drop files when the cursor is not



Use the left or right* button to drag and drop files.

If you click in an area which is not currently selected only the file or folder under the hand will be dragged.

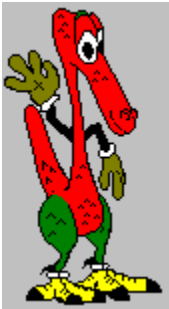
Note: Valid drop targets will also have a red border when you move over them.

Depending on the window from which you are dragging files you may drop on many different window areas , including: **Toolbar buttons, folders, Zip files or Zip view windows etc.**

(* Note: If you use the right button to drag a context menu will appear when you complete the selection.

Finder view on your computer.

Use this button to add to this
Zip file. (the Wizard will help you).

Use this button to extract from this
Zip file. (the Wizard will help you).

Click this to access the
Zip List menu.

Click this to access the
Zip List toolbar.

Click this to toggle the
Zip List view.

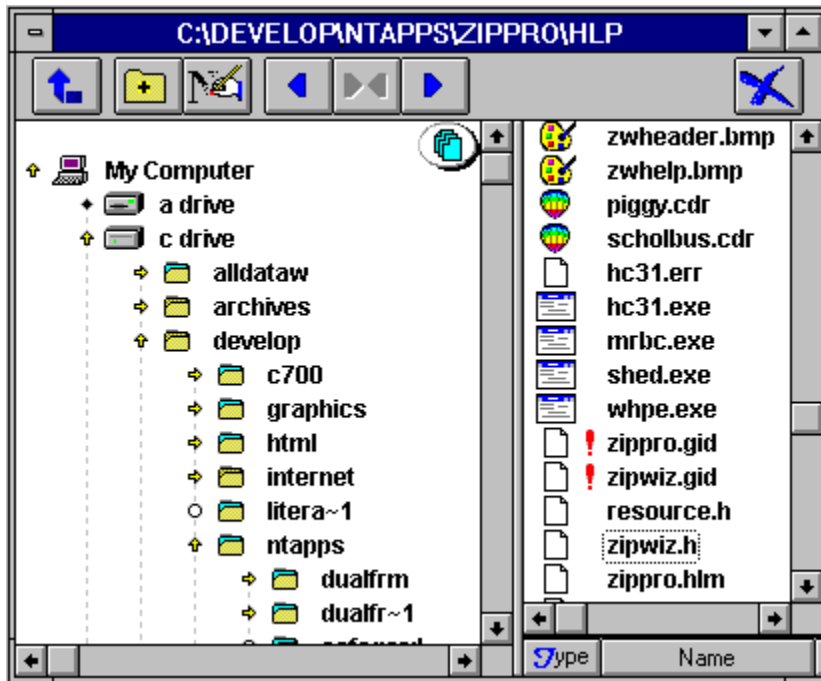
(Note: When adding files to a Zip, the original files are left intact)

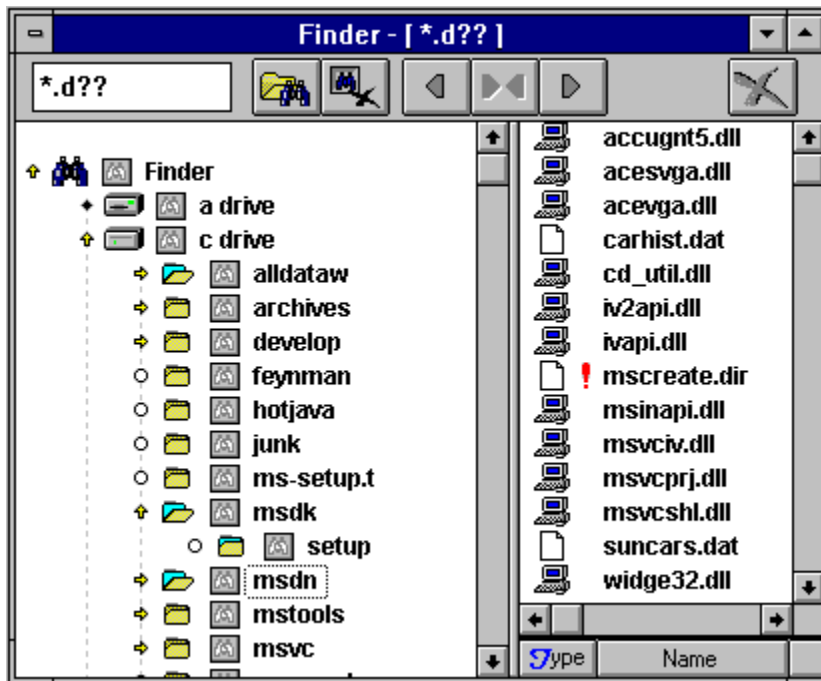
