














Zip Pro Navigator

Introduction:

The Navigator provides you with the tools you require to manage your computer files and Zip archives. The Navigator was designed with intrinsic support for Zip files and thereby provides you with specialized tools and features to efficiently manage your Zip archives and normal disk files.

Zip files contain compressed* copies of one or more files merged into a single file. Use the Zip Content Window to view the details of all the files contained within a selected Zip file.

Use the Computer Window to manage the files on your computer.

Use the Finder Window to locate files or groups of files whether they be in various folders on one drive, or distrubuted across many drives or even your network.

General

Access all or just a select subset of your Zip files instantly through the Zip List. This Synaptek innovation is a special system folder which shows the Zip files available on your computer even though they may be located in different folders or on different drives.

General

The Navigator also completely integrates the power of the Zip Wizard. This provides you with context sensitive support for managing the contents of your Zip files in as efficient a manner as possible.

Viewing the contents of your Zip files.

General

Each Zip file on your computer contains one or more files. To use these files you must first extract them. While in the Zip file they may be compressed or encrypted depending on how the Zip file was created. Zip files may also be created that span several diskettes.

General

Use the <u>Zip Window</u> to see all the files contained within a selected Zip file. You can open as many different Zip Windows at once as you desire.

Viewing the Files on your computer.

General

The Computer Window is the tool that you use to view and manipulate the files on your computer.

General

The <u>Computer Window</u> displays the contents of one folder at a time. You can also view your computers folders in a hierarchical Tree format, or a split view that shows both the Tree format and the Content side by side.

Finding files.

General

There are many times when you need to locate specific files or groups of files on your computer. The Finder Window is the tool that you use to view and manipulate groups of files.

General

The <u>Finder Window</u> displays lists of files which you define, whether they are in different folder, drives or even on different computers connected to your network. Once you define what files you are looking for, you simply click and drag to see matching files. Special scan features are also available to quickly search folders and subfolders for matches to your query.

General

Once found, you can easily add the selection or any part of it to a Zip file or you can also move, copy or delete any of the files you desire.

What is a Zip List anyway?

General

The Zip List was created to provide you easy access to your Zip files no matter where they are on your computer. The Zip List appears as a folder located in your Computer Folder. It contains pointers to any of the Zip files on your computer you want. Note that the actual Zip files reside in different folders on your computer or network, the Zip List is not a real folder on your computer.

General


Even though the Zip List is not a real folder you can copy, move, open, etc. the Zip files it contains just as if they were the real files. Therefore if you delete a file in the Zip List you delete the file from its current folder. You can edit the folders which appear in the Zip List to provide a listing of only the folders you desire.

General

There are 2 ways of accessing your Zip List.

The <u>Docked Zip List</u> is a special window that sticks to the right side of the Navigator window and overlays all other view windows. The Docked view provides you with quick access to your Zip files. You can hide or show the Docked Window using the Toolbar.

The second way to use your Zip List is from the Computer Window. The Zip List appears as a subfolder of your "My Computer" folder. Right clicking a Zip file in this view is the quickest way to locate its home folder.

Introduction.

General

When you open a Zip file, the Zip Window shows you what files and folders are inside it.

General

You can drag files and folders into this window to add them to the associated Zip file or drag them out to other folders on your computer to extract them.

General

You can also use the Zip and Unzip Wizards on the toolbar to add or update the files in the Zip or extract files from the Zip.

(Note: The Zip Window has the distinctive Big Z logo (tm) in the background.)



Deleting files.

Note: When you delete files from a Zip file, all data in the deleted files is lost, any remaining files in the Zip file are left intact.

Selecting.

Using the Mouse:

General

There are two main modes for selecting files.

New selection mode: Click and drag to create a selection, any files previously selected will be deselected. This is the default mode when the **cursor is to the right** of the object name.

Add / remove mode: Click and drag to add or remove files from the current selection. This is the default mode when the cursor is to the left of the object name.

Use can use the left or right button to select files.

- If you use the right button to select files a context menu will appear when you complete the selection.

To switch between modes:

- press and hold the Ctrl key.
- then Click a mouse button (and drag).

Introduction.

The Computer Window show you the contents of the folders on your computer in a multiview format.

The default view is the Content View which displays the contents of one folder at a time.

The currently cursored folder in the Tree View is the folder whose contents are displayed in the Content View.





Selected or scanned folders are displayed in the Content View, which can display the contents of many folders simultaneously.

General Use this method to search all the folders on your local drives.
Click the "Search My Computer" button in the toolbar. Searches of this type can be long.
Click and drag search:
General Use the Click and Drag method to display matching files from specific folders.
Browse to the folder or folders you want to search in the Tree View and select those folders.





The Dock Zip List is a special window that sticks to the right side of the Navigator window to provide quick access to your Zip files.

The Docked Zip List overlays any other windows in the Navigator but you can show or hide the Docked window as required using the menu or toolbar.

You can edit the contents of the Zip List as required using the Tree View in the Docked Window the same way as you use a Finder Window. The Zip List can also be cleared or rebuilt using the menu or toolbar.





The Navigator has several views you can use to manipulate the contents of your computer and your Zip files.

The **Zip** and **Unzip** Wizards are fully integrated into the Navigator. The Wizard system is fully context sensitive and provides you the assistance you need to complete the specific Zip and Unzip operations you are performing.



The **<u>Zip Window</u>** gives you access to the files packaged within your Zip files.

General


The <u>Computer Window</u> shows the contents of your drives in a similar manner to Explorer. Unlike Explorer it has intrinsic support for Zip files. This allows you to drag and drop not only into an out of Zip files but also to create new Zip files by dropping a selection on a folder.

General


The **<u>Finder Window</u>** allows you find and manipulate groups of files across folders, drives or network. You simply click and drag to find the files your looking for.

General

The **Docked Zip List** makes all your Zip files instantly accessible. This special window sticks to the right side of your Zip Wizard window and overlays all other views. This way, adding to any Zip file is a quick drag and drop. (The Zip List is also available in a normal Computer Window.)

The Content View shows the contents of **one** folder at a time. Double click folder entries to view their contents or click the Parent button to see the parent folders contents. You may sort the Content View using the tool at the bottom. Double click files to Launch them. Tree View:

The Tree View shows a hierarchical representation of the folders on your computer. The tree view is expandable using the arrows which appear to the left of the folder name. Most folders are ordinary directories on your computer, others are special objects that have unique properties all there own. The Zip List folder

appears as a subfolder of your computer object. The contents of the cursored folder are shown in the content view on the right.

The Finder View shows the contents of **one or more** folders at a time. Clicking folders in the **tree view** will show **matching** files in the Finder View. You may sort the Finder View using the tool at the bottom. Double click files to Launch them. You may drag files from the Finder View to any normal folder on your computer.


Tree View:

The Tree View shows a hierarchical representation of the folders on your computer. The tree

The **Docked Zip List** Window sticks to the right side of the Navigator window and **overlays all other Navigator windows**. You can hide or show it using the <u>Zip List</u> button on the toolbar.

The Zip List is a **special object** that contains **pointers to Zip files** on your computer or network. Although it appears as a folder, it does not exist on a drive and only has pointers to the actual files in their folders. However you may manipulate these files just as you would in a Finder Window. (The Docked Zip List is actually a special Finder Window that only finds ".zip" files).

This is a split view which provides a tree style view in the left pane and a Zip List view in the right pane. The **default view** is the Zip List View. (<u>Click here</u> for information on switching views.)

Zip List View:

The Zip List View shows the contents of **one or more** folders at a time. You can add and remove folders from the Zip List, thereby showing or hiding the Zip files that they contain. You cannot exclude or add individual Zip files from a specific folder.

Double click Zip files to view their contents. You may sort the Zip List View using the tool at the bottom.

Tree View:

Use the Tree View to **edit the contents** of the Zip List View. The Tree View shows a hierarchical representation of the folders on your computer.

Use the **scan buttons** to the left of the folder name to selectively **scan subfolders** for Zip files and automatically add them to the Zip List. The only way that the Zip List tree view differs from a Finder tree view is that you must explicitly clear the list to remove all its entries. (i.e. clicking to the right of the folder name does not clear the list, it adds or removes the folders just like clicking to the left of the folder name.)







General Zip Wizard Overview

Zip files are files on your computer that contain one or more compressed* files and folders.

Each Zip file can contain many files and folders, and you may: add, extract, remove (etc.) these files using **Zip Wizard**. Think of Zip files as shipping boxes that you pack with files, for storage or to ship elsewhere. You will find many packages distributed on the internet in this manner.

Zip Wizard is a series of panels which lead you through the process of creating a Zip file or updating an existing one.

Using **IntelliZIP** technology, Zip Wizard automates the process as much as possible. We have done away with confusing options. You select the files and folders that you want to Zip, and Zip Wizard takes care of the rest just like a copy or move operation. (click here for detailed instructions)

Zipping is a simple three step process.



1. Select the files you want to Zip.

2. Give a name to your Zip file.

3. Tell Zip Wizard to create or update the Zip file.

You may create a Zip file in any normal folder on your computer. Zip Wizard has facilities to help you to **organize your Zip files** on your computer.

The Zip **Home folder** is the default location where your Zip files will be placed. (You may change the location and name of your Home folder by using the options panel). You can put your Zip files directly in the Home folder. However, creating subfolders in the Home folder which are specific to your project or operation. (e.g. "Backups", "My Documents" or "Mail Archive"), will help to further organize your work environment.

Once you have created a Zip file you may add to, **update**, **freshen or delete** the files it contains. Also, note that you can move your Zip files to any folder on your computer or **send them** to others electronically or on diskettes.

For **privacy** you can **encrypt** your Zipped files with a password, so that only you or people you are sending the information to are the only ones that can extract the information from the Zip file.

If you have **large** amounts of information you want to send by diskette, Zip Wizard allows you to create Zip files that **span across diskettes**. This allows you to send unlimited quantities of data in a highly compressed, secure manner as required.

*Note: Files in a Zip archive need not be compressed.
