RGB Editor for Windows 95/NT

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Overview

RGB Editor is a small utility useful for selecting and creating RGB colors for programming projects. The values of the red, green and blue components are displayed and easily transferred to your source code files. Custom colors can be defined and saved for use in other coding projects. Custom colors swatches can also be copied to the clipboard.

RGB Editor is fully Y2K compliant and will work with MS Windows 98 as well as 95/NT systems.

Purchasing RGB Editor

RGB Editor for Windows 95/NT is a fully functioning program. It is not crippled in any way.

RGB Editor for Windows 95/NT is distributed as <u>shareware</u>. You may evaluate it free of charge for 30 days. After 30 days you are required to <u>register</u> it. If after evaluating RGB Editor for 30 days you decide not to register it you are required to <u>remove</u> it from your computer.

Registration entitles you to unlimited free updates and support via E-Mail or telephone.

You may also purchase RGB Editor for Windows 95/NT using your credit card via the Internet or by telephone.

Desktop Locations

RGB Editor's location on the desktop is saved when the program is exited. Whenever you start RGB Editor it will reappear on the desktop where you last placed it. RGB Editor property sheet locations are also stored and reused the next time they are opened.

Taskbar Tray

RGB Editor for Windows 95/NT can be optionally configured to place its program icon in the Taskbar Icon Notification Tray. This option provides a simple means of keeping the taskbar button region clear for other running programs.

Installing RGB Editor

Installation

To install RGB Editor for Windows 95/NT on your computer simply create a new, empty folder and place the files; RGB.EXE, RGB.HLP and RGB.CNT there.

RGB.EXE	- The RGB Editor Application
RGB.HLP	- The Windows 95/NT Help File
RGB.CNT	- The Help Contents File

If you installed RGB Editor for Windows 95/NT using the SETUP.EXE program and selected the default installation setting RGB Editor for Windows 95/NT will be installed in the C:\Program Files\Software by Design folder.

To integrate RGB Editor for Windows 95/NT with the MS Windows Explorer select the RGB Editor <u>Explorer Setup</u> property sheet while RGB Editor is running.

Note If you have an earlier version of RGB Editor for Windows 95/NT installed on your computer, simply replace the RGB.EXE, RGB.HLP and RGB.CNT files with the newer versions.

Note The RGB.INI file is no longer used and can be deleted. The various application settings specified in the <u>RGB Editor</u> <u>Options</u> property sheet as well as the main window's size and location on the desktop are now stored in the MS Windows 95/NT <u>System Registry</u>.

Note Some earlier versions of RGB Editor for Windows 95/NT included a RGB.WRI documentation file. This file has been replaced by the RGB.HLP file and can now be deleted.

Warning If you rename the RGB.EXE file you must also rename the HLP file using the same basename. For example if you change the RGB Editor application file name to NewName.exe, rename the help file to NewName.hlp. Do not rename the RGB.CNT file however. The HLP and CNT files *must* reside in the same folder as the RGB Editor application file itself.

Configuring RGB Editor

RGB Editor Options

Select the **File | Options** menu item to display the RGB Editor Options property sheet. This window will allow you to change the various RGB Editor program settings listed below.

Launch Multiple Instances

Check this item to allow more than one instance of RGB Editor to be run on the desktop.

Place Icon in Taskbar Tray

Check this item to display a small RGB Editor program icon in the Taskbar Icon Notification Tray. If this item is selected and the RGB Editor window is minimized a button will not be added to the Taskbar, to restore the RGB Editor window on the desktop press the small icon in the taskbar tray instead. This option is available to keep the taskbar free for other running programs.

Note When this option is selected, clicking on the Close box in the upper right-hand corner of the window title bar will minimize RGB Editor instead of closing the application. To quit RGB Editor right-click with your mouse on the RGB Editor icon in the Taskbar tray. You may also use the **File | Exit** menu command or the **Ctrl+Q** keyboard shortcut.

Confirm Program Exit

Check this item to confirm quitting RGB Editor for Windows 95/NT. When this option is selected you will be prompted to confirm your intention to exit RGB Editor and return to the MS Explorer desktop. This item is useful if you run RGB Editor from the tray and wish to avoid accidental exits when you right-click on the RGB Editor tray icon.

Select the Type of Macro to be Copied to Clipboard

Select the types of macro to be copied to the clipboard. This setting allow you to specify the text format for the RGB macro that is copied to the MS Windows Clipboard. This macro can then be copied into your program project source code or HTML file.

RGB Macro

Select this type to copy the currently selected color definition in the **RGB (128,128,128)** format. This format is useful for Visual BASIC and some C Language source code files.

Hexadecimal

Select this type to copy the currently selected color definition in the **0x00808080** format. This format is useful for Visual C and Assembly Language source code files.

HTML Macro

Select this type to copy the currently selected color definition in the "#808080" format. This format is useful for most HTML file editors.

Specify the Color Swatch Size for Clipboard Copies

The currently selected RGB color can be copied to the MS Windows Clipboard as a small rectangular bitmap suitable for pasting into a graphics editing utility. Use the setting described below to specify the size of the color swatch to be copied to the Clipboard.

Width

Use this entry field to specify the width (in pixels) of the color swatch. The color swatch width can be between 8 and 256 pixels.

<u>H</u>eight

Use this entry field to specify the height (in pixels) of the color swatch. The color swatch height can be between 8 and 256 pixels.

Camera Shutter Sound when Copying

Check this box to play an SLR camera shutter sound when copying RGB Macro or Color Swatches to the MS Windows Clipboard.

Sounds with Warning Dialog Boxes

Check this box to play a short beep sound when RGB Editor displays a warning dialog box or an error occurs.

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Press this button when you have completed your selection of RGB Editor program options. When you press this button the RGB Editor Options property sheet will be closed and your settings will be saved.

Cancel

Press this button to close the RGB Editor Options property sheet without making any changes. If you have made any changes to the option settings, and then press this button your changes will not be used, and your previous settings will remain in use.

Help Press this button to open the RGB Editor Help window and go directly to the Configuring RGB Editor topic.

Note The options you have selected will be saved when you press the **OK** button. The desktop location of the RGB Editor Options window itself will also be stored. Your settings will be saved in the MS Windows 95/NT <u>System Registry</u>.

RGB Editor Explorer Setup

RGB Editor Explorer Setup

Select the **Help** | **Setup** menu item to display the RGB Editor Setup property sheet. This window will allow you to integrate RGB Editor for Windows 95/NT with the Microsoft Windows 95/NT Explorer. Use this command to create and remove MS Explorer shortcuts.

Create a Start Menu Item

Check this item to create a RGB Editor Start Menu entry. The RGB Editor for Windows 95/NT program will be located in the Software by Design folder on the Programs menu. This item will be disabled (grayed) if a RGB Editor item already exists in the Software by Design folder.

Remove this Start Menu Item

Check this item to remove the RGB Editor entry located in the Software by Design folder on the Programs menu. This item will be disabled (grayed) if a RGB Editor item does not already exist in the Software by Design folder.

Create a Desktop Icon

Check this item to create a RGB Editor for Windows 95/NT program icon on the Explorer desktop. This item will be disabled (grayed) if a RGB Editor desktop icon already exists.

Remove Icon from the Desktop

Check this item to remove the RGB Editor for Windows 95/NT program icon from the Explorer desktop. This item will be disabled (grayed) if a RGB Editor desktop icon does not already exist.

Create a Startup Folder Item

Check this item to automatically run RGB Editor for Windows 95/NT whenever Microsoft Windows is started. This option creates a RGB Editor program icon in the MS Windows Explorer Startup folder. This item will be disabled (grayed) if a RGB Editor startup item already exists in the Startup folder.

Remove the Startup Folder Item

Check this item to remove RGB Editor from the MS Windows Explorer Startup folder. This item will be disabled (grayed) if a RGB Editor startup item does not already exist in the Startup folder.

ΟΚ

Press this button when you have completed your selection of MS Explorer shortcuts. When you press this button the RGB Editor Setup property sheet will be closed and the MS Explorer shortcuts you have selected will be created or removed.

Cancel

Press this button to close the RGB Editor Explorer Setup property sheet without creating or removing any MS Explorer shortcuts.

Help

Press this button to open the RGB Editor Help window and go directly to the RGB Editor Explorer Setup topic.

Using RGB Editor

Using the RGB Editor

The RGB Editor displays the currently selected color in the viewing region at the top of the main window. Three slider controls are provided directly beneath this region.

Use these slider controls to adjust the Red, Green and Blue components of the color you wish to create.

Each of the slider control values can be adjusted from between 0 and 255. As adjustments are made to these controls the resulting color combination will be automatically displayed directly above.

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Tip Double-Click your mouse on the color region of the window to quickly open the standard MS Windows Color Editing dialog box.

File Menu

File Menu Commands

The File menu provides commands to configure the RGB Editor. A short description of each item follows:

Options

Opens the <u>RGB Editor Options</u> property sheet and allows you to change RGB Editor program settings. Use this command to configure the RGB Editor program.

Exit

Closes the RGB Editor program and returns control to the Explorer desktop. The Ctrl+Q shortcut can be used for this command.

Tip Commonly used File commands can be invoked using shortcut keys.

Edit Menu

Edit Menu Commands

The Edit menu provides commands used to edit the contents of RGB Editor documents. A short description of each item follows:

<u>С</u>ору

Copies the current color selection to the Clipboard as a programming text macro. The **Ctrl+C** shortcut can be used for this command.

Copy Swatch

Copies the current color selection to the Clipboard as a small color swatch bitmap. The **Ctrl+S** shortcut can be used for this command.

Edit Colors

Use this command to open the standard MS Windows Color Selection dialog box. The Ctrl+E shortcut can be used for this command.

Tip Commonly used Edit commands can be invoked using shortcut keys.

View Menu

View Menu Commands

The View menu provides commands used to change RGB Editor display options. These items provide a means of changing the RGB Editor window appearance. A short description of each item follows:

<u>M</u>inimize

Minimizes the RGB Editor window to a button or icon on the taskbar. The Ctrl+Y shortcut can be used for this command.

Always on Top

Use this command to keep the RGB Editor window top most on the desktop. When this item is checked the RGB Editor window will float above all other non-topmost windows on the desktop. This item is useful if you normally run RGB Editor with a small window that would be easily obscured by other applications. The **Ctrl+T** shortcut can be used for this command.

Tip Commonly used View commands can be invoked using shortcut keys.

Help Menu

Help Menu Commands

The Help menu provides commands used to get help with RGB Editor operations. A short description of each item follows:

<u>C</u>ontents

Opens the RGB Editor Help window and displays the Table of Contents. The F1 shortcut can be used for this command.

Search

Opens RGB Editor Help and displays the Search window. You can use this window to search for specific RGB Editor help topics.

How to Use Help

Opens a Help window that explains how to use the MS Windows 95/NT Help program.

Register

Displays the RGB Editor <u>Shareware Registration Wizard</u>. This wizard allows you to register RGB Editor for Windows 95/NT for authorized use.

Setup

Displays the RGB Editor Explorer Setup property sheet. This window provides options to integrate RGB Editor with the MS Windows Explorer. Use this window to create MS Explorer Start Menu items and desktop icons.

<u>W</u>eb Site

Opens your web browser application and goes directly to the Software Design web site on the Internet.

Send E-Mail to Author

Opens your Internet eMail client application and allows you to send an eMail message directly to the author at <u>Gregory_Braun@CompuServe.com</u>.

Note You must have your Internet eMail client software configured as your default Simple MAPI client for this command to work properly.

About RGB Editor

Displays the RGB Editor splash box. This window contains program information, the current version of RGB Editor you are running and a program copyright notice. Click the mouse anywhere in this window to close it

Tip Commonly used Help commands can be invoked using shortcut keys.

Shortcut Keys

Shortcuts Shortcut keys allow you to quickly invoke RGB Editor menu commands without first displaying the menu and then selecting an item from it. The most commonly used RGB Editor commands can be invoked using the following shortcut keys.

System Registry

RGB Editor for Windows 95/NT System Registry Key

RGB Editor for Windows 95/NT stores configuration settings in the MS Windows 95/NT System Registry. These settings are updated automatically while RGB Editor is running. There is no need to edit these settings manually.

If you insist upon editing these settings, you do so at your own risk. RGB Editor automatically updates registry entries when it exits. If you edit these settings make sure RGB Editor is not running while you edit them. If RGB Editor is currently running your changes will be overwritten when RGB Editor exits.

RGB Editor for Windows 95/NT stores configuration settings in the following system registry key:

HKEY_CURRENT_USER Software Software by Design RGB Editor for Windows 95/NT Section Label = Value

Warning There is no need to edit these settings manually. RGB Editor will automatically maintain these settings for you. If you do edit these, you do so at your own risk.

Removing RGB Editor

Removing RGB Editor for Windows 95/NT

If you find that RGB Editor for Windows 95/NT does not meet your needs you can remove it from your computer system by simply deleting the following files from your hard drive.

All of these files will be located in the folder that you originally installed RGB Editor in.

The default location for all RGB Editor for Windows 95/NT program files is the **C:\Program Files\Software by Design** folder. Unless you specified a different folder when you ran SETUP.EXE you will find the RGB Editor files here.

rgb.cnt	RGB Editor Help Topics File
rgb.hlp	RGB Editor Help File

If you have opened and used the RGB Editor for Windows 95/NT Help files your system may contain the following two (2) files. These files are created by the standard MS Windows 95/NT Help program WinHlp32.exe. These files may also be safely removed.

- **rgb.gid** MS Windows Help settings file. This file contains the RGB Editor Help window size and desktop location as well as any bookmarks you may have created.
- **rgb.fts** MS Windows Help word database. This file is created when you build a custom word list for RGB Editor Help files. This file is used to search for words and phrases in the RGB Editor Help files.

RGB Editor for Windows 95/NT does not use any custom DLL files or system drivers. If you delete the files mentioned above from your system's hard drive you will have completely removed RGB Editor from your computer system.

Note If you have installed RGB Editor shortcuts on the MS Explorer Start Menu use the Help | Setup command to remove the shortcuts you created before you delete the RGB Editor files mentioned above.

What is Shareware

The concept of "Shareware" ...

Shareware, also known as user supported software and other names, is a concept not understood by everyone. The author of Shareware retains all rights to the software under the copyright laws while still allowing free distribution.
